Basically, search for 'Find a Grave uk' and make sure that you are at 'www.findagrave.com'

- For a general search In the '<u>Cemetery Location'</u> box enter 'Quorn, Charnwood Borough' then press the 'Search' button.
- Then scroll up to see all the photos of the memorials which are in alphabetic order.
- OR, for specific searches use the table to enter names etc. then press the 'search' button.
