
Quorn Local History Group - Newsletter - 20th March 2023

Don Wix

We are sad to report the death of one of our two honorary members, Don Wix aged 94. Don lived on Warwick Avenue and during his working life was a teacher at Garendon High School in Loughborough. However in Quorn, Don will probably be remembered most for his huge contribution to local history and in particular the local history of Quorn. He was responsible for the publication of 'Bygone Quorn in Photographs' in 1984, which remains the most comprehensive book about the history of our village. He also wrote many other books in collaboration with his great friend Ian Keil, from Loughborough University, including 'Rawlins The First Three Hundred Years' and many books about Loughborough and the Charnwood area. Coming up to the millennium in 1999, Don was determined that Quorn should mark the occasion in a fitting way and he was instrumental in the creation of Quorn's 'Millennium Map' which stands on Quorn Cross today. Don will be sadly missed.

The funeral will be held on Thursday 23rd March at 10.15am at Loughborough Crematorium and there will be refreshments in Loughborough afterwards.
