**Talks Programme** – On Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> of September we welcome Peter Liddle who will present "The Vikings in Leicestershire". Vikings first appear as raiders in England in the late 8th century and in 865AD the Viking Great Army begins an attempt to conquer England. We are now starting to see the archaeological evidence for Vikings in the East Midlands to go alongside the place name evidence. Peter is a retired Museum curator and archaeologist whose main interest is in Leicestershire Archaeology. He joined Leicestershire Museums in 1976 as an Archaeological Survey Officer and went on to become Keeper of Archaeology and then Community Archaeologist for the County. He was also an Associate Lecturer at Leicester University. Retiring in 2012 Peter is now Chair of Leicestershire Fieldworkers a voluntary group of some 400 members organising fieldwork in Leicestershire and Rutland.

The talk will commence at the Church Room at 7pm, just £2 for members and £4 for guests. Refreshments included - All welcome!
