**Quorn Local History Exhibition** – The group are considering organising a village history exhibition later in the year. Individuals and village groups and businesses would be encouraged to provide artefacts and displays that reflect Quorn's rich history. In the early 1970's the Leicestershire County Library Service had a policy of encouraging interest in local history. Village local history exhibitions were organised in a number of villages including Foxton, Woodhouse Eaves, Woodhouse, Swithland and Mountsorrel. A Quorn Local History Exhibition was planned, but sadly due to
